Sé1Haz1 (Be1Make1)

Six Wednesdays in Jan-Feb we tried something new—a training on the basics of what it means to *be* a disciple and how to *make* a disciple—the heartbeat of what we pray will happen in students here in Puerto Rico. Grateful for the four small group Bible studies that formed in the first semester, we wanted to invite them to something more. I expected 4-6 to commit, but God surprised me with 11 who said yes!

Each week focused on a key aspect of *knowing Christ* and a key aspect of *making Him known*. During the topic of relating to others, I asked, “How will someone know whether or not we actually care about them?” “You share the 3 circles of the gospel with them,” Jack* said immediately. Though not what I expected, it showed the impact of sharing the gospel when we first met him. Jack now identifies with Jesus, and was one of the most faithful participants in the Sé1Haz1 training!
